Ramadan

Wednesday evening, March 22, 2023 – Thursday evening, April 20, 2023 Ramadan is considered one of the holiest months of the year for Muslims, during which time Muslims commemorate the revelation of the Qur'an. It is

a time when fasting from food and drink during the sunlit hours is a means of drawing closer to God while cultivating self-control, gratitude, and compassion for those less fortunate. Ramadan is a month of intense spiritual rejuvenation with a heightened focus on devotion, during which Muslims spend extra time reading the Qur'an and performing special prayers.



Holy Week & Easter



Sunday, April 2, 2023 – Sunday, April 9, 2023

In the Christian church, Holy Week is observed beginning on Palm Sunday (April 2) and ending with the celebration of Easter (April 9). Holy Week is a time of special solemnity with a focus on the final days of Jesus' earthly life. It is marked by the procession of Palms on April 2nd as Christian remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, followed by his Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist on Maundy Thursday (April 6). Christ's passion and death on the cross is remembered on Good Friday, April 7th. With great joy and celebration, on Easter Sunday (April 9) Christians celebrate Jesus'





resurrection from the dead as his followers discovered his empty tomb.

Passover

Wednesday evening, April 5, 2023 – Thursday evening, April 13, 2023 The holiday of Passover is perhaps one of the most central to Jewish life and history. Passover celebrates the biblical account of the Israelites' redemption and escape from 400 years of Egyptian slavery. Passover is often celebrated with great pomp and ceremony, especially on the first night, when a special family meal called the Seder is held using symbolic foods, pray-

er, storytelling, and song.
