In addition, he was the superintendent of the school for many years. Lyal was also the handyman at the church spending countless hours installing upgrades, repairs and maintenance.

He was not only a handyman but also a craftsman. He constructed a woodworking shop in his garage and built beautiful pieces of furniture. Lyal was also a Mason Shriner in the Baltimore Lodge for many years. He was an avid gardener and his favorites cover the yard. All types and colors of lilies brighten their home.
